As we look to extend our sustainable tourism practices, I'm really pleased to be working on our digital port guides which provide guests with local recommendations in the ports we visit.

Each guide identifies up to 18 places - which are a mix of well-known, must-see destinations and off-the-beaten-track locations. This not only enhances the guest experience in these destinations, but also unlocks sustainable tourism opportunities for local businesses and contributes to the growth of the local economy.

Moving these guides to fully digital in April 2022 will save around 383,000 sheets of paper per year and means we can keep the guides updated with new and exciting local spots to visit.

Investing in Shore Power

At Carnival UK we're committed to a pathway to decarbonisation and one of the ways we can help achieve this is through the use of shore power. Shore power allows ships to connect to the local grid when in port and switch off engines, thereby reducing emissions when alongside.

A number of ports we visit globally have shore power facilities and recently our home port of Southampton made the significant investment to offer shore power, with Queen Mary 2 chosen as the first ship to connect and draw power alongside.

At Carnival UK we have ambitious plans to retro-fit our fleet with the technology needed to connect to shore power. Queen Mary 2, Iona, and Britannia are already fitted with this capability, with the rest of the fleet following suit.

Sustainable seafood sourcing

As part of Carnival UK's Food Procurement team, we support the onboard operation and guest experience through the sourcing and supply of a vast array of categories, including seafood.

Our commitment is to follow the Marine Conservation Society's 'Good Fish Guide' and never to source seafood which is rated high impact, threatened, or endangered. We work closely with our suppliers to map our seafood supply chains, identify products that are certified sustainable, and find ways to improve our sourcing practises through recommended, more sustainable sources.

I'm proud to be supporting Carnival UK's sustainability objectives by embedding these sourcing strategies and practises into our regular operations.
